# **BOROUGH OF PERKASIE ROAD PROGRAM**

Borough Engineers conduct a Roadway Condition Survey every 2-3 years. This survey provides us with a current assessment of the existing roadway conditions and recommendations for future projects. A number of roads throughout the Borough are owned by the state and maintained by PennDOT. The Roadway Condition Survey does not examine or report on those State roads.

Pavement conditions on Borough-owned roads are rated using a methodology based on the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) Guide for Design of Pavement Structures. According to this scale, the lower the rating, the better the road condition. A higher rating means the road is in more of a need for repairs.


The Roadway Condition Survey and 5 to 15 year Reconstruction Plan was last updated in 2021. Some highlights of the survey are as follows:

- As of 2021, The Borough's overall roadway condition rating is 2.13. According to surveys carried out since 2016, this is the lowest and best rating in the last 15 years. More than 1/3 of our roadways are rated "1" (in newly paved condition) and around 80% rated "3" or better (in acceptable condition).
- The 5 -15 year reconstruction plan indicates that ALL our roads rated 4.5 and 5 will be repaired by 2025.

The Borough's road program has historically been funded by an amount set aside annually by Borough Council in the Capital Fund, and by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation Liquid Fuels Program. Keeping up with road repairs and providing proactive road maintenance has been challenging as Liquid Fuels funding has been reduced in recent years. In 2022 and 2023, Borough Council approved a 3 mill increase in real estate taxes that will be dedicated to the road program.

The dedicated road tax has made it possible for the Borough to continue with repairing the most vulnerable roads. We will be able to focus on a regular maintenance plan to preserve the quality of the roads and help to avoid more expensive road work while making the roads safer.

Changes to the curbside recycling program went into effect early in July, and we're hearing that residents find it much easier to set out paper & cardboard once per week, instead of once per month.



# **FALL LEAF COLLECTION**

Leaf collection will begin mid-October and continue through November, weather permitting. Please look for confirmed dates on the Borough's website and social media. Rake leaves into the street along the curb line without blocking or clogging storm drains. Please keep vehicles away from areas where leaves are piled.

Leaves will be picked up when scheduling allows. There are no set collection days for areas of the Borough. The Public Works crew will follow a specific route and do so cyclically.

# **CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION**

Christmas trees (without wire) are picked up along with recyclables during the first three weeks of January. Wreaths with or without wire will be collected with refuse. Live-balled Christmas trees may be donated for planting in Borough parks.

# **Electric Department Reminder**

Lately there has been an increase of flyers and signs being posted on borough utility poles. Residents are kindly reminder that it is against Borough ordinance to place any posters or signs on any borough utility poles. Please see Borough Ordinance below:

# § 85-41Attachments to Department equipment.

- **A.** It is hereby ordained by Borough Council that it shall be unlawful to attach signs, posters, placards or notices to any Department equipment, including wooden poles or lighting standards. No materials of any nature may be affixed to Department equipment without written Department permission.
- **D.** Any person who violates § 85-41 of this article shall, upon conviction, be punishable as set forth in Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article II, Violations and Penalties.

# Managing Stormwater on Your Property this Fall

Fall is here, which means there is lots of raking to do! Did you know that yard debris, including leaves and other organic plant material like shrubbery trimmings and grass clippings are a significant source of stormwater pollution? This debris can clog culverts, storm drains, and pipes, causing flooding.

Debris can also carry fertilizers and pesticides from your yard and deposit them in streams and ponds. Piles of leaves and grass clippings will overload a stream's ability to process leaf litter, causing nutrient pollution and oxygen depletion.

When working on your yard this fall, consider some of these tips to enhance water quality and manage stormwater:

- Do not pile leaves or other yard waste near streams or drainage channels where they can blow or wash into creeks. Use designated leaf collection bags for curbside leaf recycling.
- Do not blow leaves or grass clippings off your property into streets, streams, ponds, or drainage swales.
- Recycle grass clippings and their nutrients on your lawn. Mulch your leaves into your yard, or pile them in your garden areas. They will add nutrients back into your lawn and provide shelter for wildlife during the winter months.
  - **Plant a native tree!** Trees provide vital habitat for wildlife and absorb more stormwater than you lawn does.



# Keep Your Child's Summer Reading Habit Going Strong

Did your young reader enjoy summer reading at Bucks County Free Library's Perkasie branch? You can help them maintain that habit during the school year!

Even with a full schedule of homework, after-school activities and family time, caregivers can use some time-tested strategies to keep kids reading.

Model good reading habits: Make sure your kids see you reading books, newspapers or magazines every day. After all, kids learn by watching the grown-ups around them.

"When caregivers make time to read on their own – even for a few minutes a day – it shows that reading isn't just for school or just for kids," says Kate Transue, Children's Services Coordinator for Bucks County Free Library.

"Build reading into your daily routine. While your child reads a chapter of their book before bed, grab your own book and join them. Or listen to an audiobook while making dinner or driving with your kids. Talk to the staff at the library for some family-friendly options!"

Make sure they have a library card: If your child uses your library card, getting them a card of their own can help them feel ownership of their time at the library — while developing important life skills.

"Having a library card teaches children responsibility, problem-solving, and good citizenship," says Emily K., a Children's Services Librarian at the Perkasie and Quakertown branches. "It's a major milestone on the journey to becoming a lifelong reader!" Learn more about children's library cards at www.buckslib.org/your-childs-first-library-card

Let kids pick their own books: When kids select their own books, they're more likely to read them – and enjoy them! Letting your child choose their own books also reinforces that reading isn't done only at school.

"The best book for your child to read is the book your child wants to read," Emily says. "While you may need to limit the number of books they take home, avoid restricting the form those books take. Graphic novels, manga and audiobooks might not look like traditional chapter books, but the most important thing is they're reading."

Establish a library routine: Lots of families visit the Perkasie library the same day each week. "The happy memories kids make at the library help them become lifelong readers and library users," Kate says.

Whether you come for a weekly storytime or to get new books, try pairing library visits with something you already do every week. Think piano lessons, a trip to the grocery store or time at the park.

Build a book nook: It's easier to keep up with a habit when it's fun and relaxing! For school-age kids, try designating a comfy reading space where they can read on their own without distractions.

"Creating a reading nook is a fun activity to do as a family," Emily says. "Maybe it's a corner of the living room with blankets, floor cushions and cozy lighting. It could be as simple as adding a fun book light to their headboard or nightstand. The important thing is to make reading a calming, comfortable activity."




