

PERKASIE FIRE CO. CELEBRATES FIRE PREVENTION WEEK October 4 - 9

ABOUT FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

Fire Prevention Week was established to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire, the tragic 1871 conflagration that killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures and burned more than 2,000 acres. The fire began on October 8, but continued into and did most of its damage on October 9, 1871.

COMMEMORATING A CONFLAGRATION

According to popular legend, the fire broke out after a cow - belonging to Mrs. Catherine O'Leary - kicked over a lamp, setting first the barn, then the whole city on fire. Chances are you've heard some version of this story yourself; people have been blaming the Great Chicago Fire on the cow and Mrs. O'Leary, for more than 130 years. But recent research by Chicago historian Robert Cromie has helped to debunk this version of events.



THE 'MOO' MYTH

Like any good story, the 'case of the cow' has some truth to it. The great fire almost certainly started near the barn where Mrs. O'Leary kept her five milking cows. But there is no proof that O'Leary was in the barn when the fire broke out - or that a jumpy cow sparked the blaze. Mrs. O'Leary herself swore that she'd been in bed early that night, and that the cows were also tucked in for the evening.

But if a cow wasn't to blame for the huge fire, what was? Over the years, journalists and historians have offered plenty of theories. Some blamed the blaze on a couple of neighborhood boys who were near the barn sneaking cigarettes. Others believed that a neighbor of the O'Leary's may have started the fire. Some people have speculated that a fiery meteorite may have fallen to earth on October 8, starting several fires that day - in Michigan and Wisconsin, as well as in Chicago.

THE BIGGEST BLAZE THAT WEEK

While the Great Chicago Fire was the best-known blaze to start during this fiery two-day stretch, it wasn't the biggest. That distinction goes to the Peshtigo Fire, the most devastating forest fire in American history. The fire, which also occurred on October 8th, 1871, and roared through Northeast Wisconsin, burning down 16 towns, killing 1,152 people, and scorching 1.2 million acres before it ended.

Historical accounts of the fire say that the blaze began when several railroad workers clearing land for tracks unintentionally started a brush fire. Before long, the fast-moving flames were whipping through the area 'like a tornado,' some survivors said. It was the small town of Peshtigo, Wisconsin that suffered the worst damage. Within an hour, the entire town had been destroyed.

NINE DECADES OF FIRE PREVENTION

Those who survived the Chicago and Peshtigo fires never forgot what they'd been through; both blazes produced countless tales of bravery and heroism. But the fires also changed the way that firefighters and public officials thought about fire safety. On the 40th anniversary of the Great Chicago Fire, the Fire Marshals Association of North America (today known as the International Fire Marshals Association), decided that the anniversary of the Great Chicago Fire should henceforth be observed not with festivities, but in a way that would keep the public informed about the importance of fire prevention. The commemoration grew incrementally official over the years.

In 1920, President Woodrow Wilson issued the first National Fire Prevention Day proclamation, and since 1922, Fire Prevention Week has been observed on the Sunday through Saturday period in which October 9 falls. According to the National Archives and Records Administration's Library Information Center, Fire Prevention Week is the longest running public health and safety observance on record. The President of the United States has signed a proclamation proclaiming a national observance during that week every year since 1925.

FROM STEPHEN BARTH, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR

Continued new investment in Perkasio is flourishing. As outlined in the Borough's 2014 Comprehensive Plan, key economic development initiatives are bearing fruit.

HOUSING

Two housing projects, Perkasio Woods on Constitution Avenue and Country Ridge are underway and selling quickly. Hidden Meadow, which will be located off of South Main Street, will be a 54 unit single family project with new homes starting at \$400,000. This project has received final land development approvals and may begin this fall.

NEW BUSINESSES

Perkasio is adding new businesses to the community and welcomes Modern Male, a traditional men's barber shop to Walnut Street. This is Modern Male's second location.

The Ram, a proposed new restaurant and pub with rooftop dining was granted a waiver from land development by the Borough Council in August. Located in an old brick building near the corner of 7th & Chestnut Streets right in the downtown, the owner hopes to apply for building permits this fall with an expected opening in spring of 2017. The Ram will be a three story restaurant and pub with a bar and dining on the first floor, dining on the second floor and a rooftop bar, fire pit and dining on the rooftop. An elevator will provide access to all floors.

PENNRIDGE AIRPORT

The owner of the Pennridge Airport is petitioning the Perkasio Borough Council to create a new industrial zoning designation for land surrounding the runway. The parcels are already zoned industrial, but the new designation would allow for special uses because of the unique nature of the airport. The airport land is divided between Perkasio and East Rockhill Township.

The applicant is proposing development to begin first in Perkasio, with a new entrance into the airport off of Ridge Road. A small boutique hotel/ conference center is being planned along with a restaurant at the entrance.

Land parcels further down Ridge Road near Tunnel Road are proposed to be the home to new industrial space that has executive airport access. The largest executive jets can land at the airport currently. No commercial flights are allowed at the field. This is an ideal site for international businesses or companies that need access for national sales forces or clients.

The Borough is working closely with the owners of the airport to provide key incentives and attributes such as redundant electrical power. This is a key advantage in attracting new high-end tenants and a service that Perkasio's Electric Company is uniquely able to provide. Redundant power is an unusual attribute that most communities cannot provide and is highly sought after by tech companies to support their data systems without interrupted power.



Addressing Stormwater this Fall

Though it is easy to get distracted by the beautiful Fall foliage and the excitement of a new school year, it is important to learn, implement and share tips and tricks to mitigate stormwater!

Practices to prevent stormwater from negatively impacting your house and yard:

Pruning trees, shrubs and perennials - Fall is the best time to prune trees, shrubs and other perennials in your yard. Pruning allows your plants to jump start their Spring growth & helps them to utilize more stormwater.



Monitoring for erosion - As the leaves fall and as our plants enter their fall and winter dormancy continue to check your property for soil erosion caused by stormwater.



Clearing leaves and debris from gutters & installing a rain barrel - Fall, for many of us, signifies gutter cleaning season! After clearing debris from your gutters install a rain barrel at the end of your downspout. Use the free rain water from your rain barrel to wash your car or water your gardens!

Protecting stormwater drains nearby your property - Help protect the stormwater that is not funneled into your rain barrel by clearing leaves and debris which collect around nearby stormwater drains. These drains flow directly into local streams. Only water should enter storm drains!
