#### **Perkasie Borough Police Department Approved for Accreditation**

On May 21 and 22, 2024 The Perkasie Borough Police Department underwent a Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association Accreditation Assessment. This process culminated in a 2 ½ year project to gain Accreditation Status through the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association. Only 200 police departments in Pennsylvania are Accredited out of over 1,200 state and local law enforcement agencies in the Commonwealth.

According to the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association;

Accreditation is a progressive and time-proven way of helping institutions evaluate and improve their overall performance. The cornerstone of this strategy lies in the promulgation of standards containing a clear statement of professional objectives. Participating administrators then conduct a thorough analysis to determine how existing operations can be adapted to meet these objectives. When the procedures are in place, a team of independent professionals is assigned to verify that all applicable standards have been successfully implemented. The process culminates with a decision by an authoritative body that the institution is worthy of accreditation.


The Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Program was designed and developed by professional law enforcement executives to provide a reasonable and cost-effective plan for the professionalization of law enforcement agencies within the Commonwealth. The underlying philosophy of the program is to have a user-friendly undertaking for the departments that will result in a "success" oriented outcome.

The Benefits of Accreditation include:

- Establishes a credible framework for evaluating agency practices and procedures
- · Reduces agency risk and exposure to lawsuits
- · Decreases some liability insurance expenditures
- Improves law enforcement community relations
- Increases employee input, interaction, and confidence in the agency
- Enlarges the outlook and viewpoints of managers, officers, and employees
- · Identifies and highlights the capabilities and competence of the agency
- Furnishes a solid foundation for the agency to build upon for further progress
- · Provides reliable methods to improve essential management procedures
- Extends agency accountability to the public and elected officials
- Enhances planning and innovative activities by all agency personnel
- · Develops improved methods for providing services to the community
- Encourages problem-solving activities within the agency

After the assessment, at the annual Pennsylvania Chief of Police Convention on July 23, 2024, the accreditation commission reviewed the assessor's report and voted to grant initial accreditation to the Perkasie Borough Police Department.

Officer Nyce graduated from the Montgomery County Municipal Police Academy on June 12, 2024. Officer Nyce recently moved back to the area after serving as a Deputy Sheriff in Loudoun County Virginia. Officer Nyce holds the rank of Staff Sergeant in the United States Marine Corps Reserves.



Officer Compas has over fourteen years of police experience with both the Tinicum Township and Newton Borough, Bucks County Police Departments. Officer Compas is a skydiving instructor and served in the United States Marine Corps holding the rank of Sergeant. Officer Compas served in several overseas deployments during his service with the Marine Corps. We welcome Officer Nyce and Officer Compas and wish them long, happy, and healthy careers with our department.

The Police Department also welcomes Chris Doheny as our new Community Relations Specialist/Crime Victims Advocate. This new position was grantfunded for two years and came to fruition thanks to Chief Matt Phelan from Bedminster Police and his Community Relations/Crimes Victims Advocate Laurie Hepler. The position is an expanded position from the Bedminster Program into

a regional program with support from Pennsylvania State Senator Jarrett Coleman and State Representative Shelby Labs.

In his new role, Chris will be working to establish community events and education and will act as a liaison between crime victims, the police department, and the court system.

As a reminder now that school is back in service drivers are encouraged to pay particular attention to school buses dropping off and picking up students as well as students walking to and from school.

## **PUBLIC WORKS REMINDERS**

#### **FALL LEAF COLLECTION**

Fall leaf collection usually starts around mid-October into November. Rake leaves into street along the curb line. Do not block or clog storm drains.

Check the Borough website, social media, or call the Borough office for start and stop dates for leaf collection. There is no set schedule for leaf pickup. The crews follow a set route and pick up leaves as scheduling allows. The Borough crew will collect leaves one time in the spring. The date will be announced early in the year based on the end of winter weather. The crews will only travel the collection route one time for the spring collection.



Do not put leaves in the roadway or block storm drains during any other part of the year. Doing so can cause a very dangerous situation for drivers, and also possibly flood the roadway by clogging the storm drains.

#### **CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION**

Christmas trees (without wire) are collected with brush pick-up on the first Wednesday in January, and on the second, third and fourth Fridays in January. Please check the Borough website and social media or call the Borough office for any updates to this schedule.

#### **RECYCLING CENTER**

Located at 311 S. 9TH ST. and open Monday-Friday 7:30a-8:30p and Saturdays 7:30a-4:00p (Closed Sundays and most holidays). Residents must display a Borough hang tag on their car in order to use the recycling center. Staff may request additional proof of residence. Do not lend your hang tag to non-residents.

Prepare your recyclables as you would for curbside recycling. Recycling dumpsters are marked; please make sure to use the correct one. DO NOT PUT PLASTIC BAGS IN DUMPSTERS.

TRASH and BULK TRASH items ARE NOT accepted at the recycling center.

#### MANAGING STORMWATER ON YOUR PROPERTY THIS FALL

Fall is here! And with this change in season comes cooler temperatures, shorter days, and lots of yard work to tackle. When crossing off your to-do-list this fall, it's important to remember that yard debris is a significant source of stormwater pollution.

Organic plant material like grass clippings, leaves, and shrubbery trimmings can carry pesticides and fertilizers from your yard and deposit them in local waterways. Piles of leaves and grass clippings will overload a stream's ability to process leaf litter, causing nutrient pollution and oxygen depletion. Yard debris can also clog culverts, storm drains and pipes causing flooding.

Luckily, there are some easy steps that you can take on your property to reduce pollution and improve water quality!

Do not pile leaves or other yard waste near streams or drainage areas where they can blow or wash into creeks. Use designated leaf collection bags for curbside leaf recycling.



Do not blow leaves or grass clippings off of your property into streets, streams, ponds or drainage swales.



Recycle grass clippings and their nutrients by mulching them and leaves into your lawn or piling them in your garden beds. They will add nutrients back into your lawn and provide shelter for wildlife during the winter.



Plant a native tree! Trees provide vital habitat for wildlife and absorb more stormwater than your lawn does.

## **LETTER FROM THE MAYOR**

#### A FOOTBALL STORY

Fall is a wonderful time of the year as temperatures cool and we experience nature's glorious colors around us; and of course, it is football season. For many years I had the privilege of coaching the Pennridge Football Team, and I have a plethora of stories and wonderful memories of terrific young men, and coaches, with which I had the privilege to work. Here is one of those stories.

It was a snowy Thanksgiving morning and we were preparing for the traditional, emotionally-charged game against our rivals from the community north of us. For seniors on both teams, this is always a day of reflecting on a season or a career, realizing it is the last time they will play with their buddies and hoping this day, that they will never forget, is a positive memory. It's an important day! Two hours before the game as I was reminding the team of our game plan, and last second play and strategy reminders, I noticed that one of the players named Ralph (not his real name) could hardly keep his eyes open. In this situation, on this day, that was an unusual situation. After the meeting I pulled Ralph aside and let him know I noticed he could hardly stay awake and I wondered why. His response was one I will never forget: He said, "My Dad needs dialysis treatments and this morning he needed to get picked up around 7 am. Usually his driver picks him up at our house, but we have a long driveway and today it was covered with lots of snow. Our snowblower was not working which meant I needed to shovel. I got up at 3 am and shoveled until 6:30 am so I could push him in his wheelchair to the end of the drive. Coach, I'm sorry for falling asleep but I am really tired."

I am not sure exactly how I responded in the moment, but I know after the game I reflected on how this young man modeled priorities way beyond the winning of a football game. Those lessons included deep care for a loved one, a willingness to do the difficult thing to serve someone else, and a strength of character that allowed him to put the needs of others above his own needs. I was, and still am, appreciative of what I learned that day.

As we continue to live in a world that is too often filled with disagreements, disunity, discord, and self-centeredness, my hope for our wonderful Perkasie community is that we can continue to prioritize respect and care for others, and sometimes a willingness to do the difficult thing to bless someone else. We are all in this together; let's do it well.

## **CODE ENFORCEMENT**



#### **ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT REMINDERS**

#### **BRUSH COLLECTION PROGRAM**

Brush clippings will be picked up by Borough crews on the FIRST WEDNESDAY of each month as a part of the scheduled brush collection. However, collection of brush clippings will be BY APPOINTMENT ONLY. If you have brush clippings to be picked up, then you should inform the Borough Office by phone 48 hours in advance of the scheduled collection time.

Brush clippings shall be bundled with string or twine and shall not exceed ten (10) feet in length and one and one-half (1-1/2) feet in diameter. Smaller bundles should be bound with string or twine. Please take notice that logs are accepted up to 8" in diameter, no lumber is accepted in your brush piles, roots are not accepted for clipping, the amount of acceptable brush per month is a small chest freezer size amount, and no containers of brush will be accepted. Brush in containers is considered yard waste and can be dropped off on the first Saturday of the month from 7:30am until 3:30pm behind the Public Works Building.

#### ALWAYS TRAINING. ALWAYS IMPROVING.



In addition to regular training efforts and courses held at the fire station, each year members are encouraged to continue seek certification and professional training opportunities as they hone their skills – including participation in the Bucks County Community College's Fire Academy.

This year, we congratulate Firefighters Andrew Keyes and Aaron Clark who graduated from the Proboard Fire One program, and Firefighter Jesse Chubb and Captain Ryan Ross who graduated from the Proboard Fire Two program. These rigorous courses involved nearly 200 hours of classroom instruction and hands-on training, preparing our members to handle the diverse and ever evolving challenges on the fire ground.

#### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: BLUE LIGHTS

Have you ever noticed a vehicle with flashing blue lights on the road and wondered what it means? In many areas, including our community, blue lights are used by volunteer firefighters in their personal vehicles when responding to the station for emergency calls.

Unlike the red and blue lights on police vehicles or the red lights on fire trucks, blue lights alone do not require you to pull over or give the right of way. However, they do indicate that the driver is heading to an emergency, and your cooperation can help save lives.

If you see a vehicle with flashing blue lights, it's courteous and helpful to safely move over when possible, allowing them to pass more quickly. Remember, every second counts in an emergency response. By being aware of what blue lights mean and reacting appropriately, you're playing a vital role in supporting our volunteer firefighters and helping them protect our community more effectively.





# Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law Pennsylvania Vehicle Code

#### **KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE**

When a School Bus is stopped on a highway or traffic way with its red lights flashing and side arm extended, a driver following or approaching must stop at least 10 feet from reaching the bus and remain stationary until the lights on the bus are turned off or the children who may have alighted (stepped down or dismounted) have reached a place of safety.

The driver of a vehicle approaching an intersection at which a School Bus is stopped shall stop his vehicle at that intersection until the flashing red signal lights on the School Bus are no longer activated.

If you are convicted of violating Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law, you will receive all of the following **Penalties:** 

- FINE \$250.00
- When a school bus is equipped with a side stop arm enforcement system and you pass a school bus with its red lights flashing, you may receive a \$300 total fine in the mail.
- 60 Day Driver's License Suspension
- Five (5) points on your driving record

Your requirements and responsibilities as a licensed Pennsylvania driver are to obey the School Bus Stopping Law.

- When you meet or overtake a stopped school bus with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you MUST STOP.
- When you meet or overtake a stopped school bus with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you MUST STOP.

- When you approach an inter section where a school bus is stopped with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you MUST STOP.
- You MUST STOP at least ten (10) feet away from the school bus.
- You MUST WAIT until the red lights have stopped flashing and the stop arm has been withdrawn before moving.
- DO NOT MOVE until all the children have reached a place of safety.


