### PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

Council President Ryder remarked how proud he is of the community and remarked how everything worked out great with the rally that was held over the weekend, adding that there were no issues and it was nice to see things done in a civilized manner.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Upon a motion by Worthington, seconded by Rose, Council unanimously approved the minutes

from the Council meeting on September 15, 2025, the special Finance Committee meetings on September 22, 2025 and October 6, 2025, the Public Safety Committee meeting on September 24, 2025 and the Council Committee meeting on October 6, 2025.

#### **CORRESPONDENCE AND REPORTS**

#### Mayor's Report

Mayor Hollenbach gave an update on RAM Packs, who are currently serving 220 children, and asked everyone to support them when you can, adding that he also appreciates everything that they do, along with Pennridge FISH and Re:Vivals. The Mayor then shared with Council that 30 kids from the high school football team came out on Saturday, October 4<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 am to serve about 100 cars, after getting home after 11:00 pm the night before after their away game.

#### **Taxes Collected**

Upon a motion by Faulkner, seconded by Rose, Council unanimously approved the Taxes Collected Report for September, 2025.

#### **Budget Status**

Upon a motion by Faulkner, seconded by Weaver, Council unanimously accepted the Budget Status report for the month of September, 2025.

#### **Engineer's Report**

The Engineer reported that the MS4 Report was submitted at the end of September. As part of the 2025 Road Program, milling and paving work on South Second Street will start tomorrow. The Engineer also provided an update on the Kulp Park Improvements Project.

Upon a motion by Laustsen, seconded by Weaver, Council unanimously accepted the Engineer's monthly reports for the month of September, 2025.

#### Planning Commission Report

The Planning Commission will meet this month to discuss accessory dwelling units. The Assistant Borough Manager summarized what the Planning Commission will review at their meeting, adding that the current ordinance doesn't currently address accessory dwelling units. Councilman Bomboy asked about Air B&Bs or VRBO, and Ms. Reid informed him that those fall into a different use category, but can be researched further, if Council chooses.

#### **Zoning Hearing Board Report**

The Zoning Hearing Board will meet this month to review an application for a use variance at 505 Constitution Avenue. The Solicitor will attend the Zoning Hearing Board meeting to present Council's position, which is to oppose this application.

#### **Police Report**

The Police Chief informed Council there were 524 calls for the month of September, 181 of which were in Sellersville Borough. The Community Civilian Specialist had 31 outreaches throughout the month.

The Public Works Superintendent informed Council that the new truck was parked outside for those who wanted to see it, and added that leaf collection started today.

#### Consider Resolution #2025-49 - Removal of Handicap Spot at 311 West Walnut Street

Upon a motion by Rose, seconded by Worthington, Council unanimously approved Resolution #2025-49, which rescinds the handicapped parking space at 311 West Walnut Street.

#### Consider Submission of TASA Application – Park Avenue Improvements Project

The Parks & Recreation Director informed Council that the first Parents Night Out event was held in-house in September, and 7 kids attended; 12 kids attended October's Parents Night Out. Ms. Moll stated that this is a great event for the kids and for economic development in the Borough, since parents can visit Borough businesses while their children are at Borough Hall for the event. She also reported that the amphitheater safety lighting upgrades were recently installed as a result of a grant from Perkasie Industrial Development Authority.

Upon a motion by Schilling, seconded by Weaver, Council unanimously approved Resolution #2025-50, a resolution of the Borough Council of the Borough of Perkasie, Bucks County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, authorizing application for a Local Share Assessment Grant for a hook truck.

<u>Consider Resolution #2025-51 – LSA Grant Application for Police Department – Event Safety Barricade Program</u>

Upon a motion by Worthington, seconded by Laustsen, Council approved Resolution #2025-51, a resolution of the Borough Council of the Borough of Perkasie, County of Bucks, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, authorizing application for a Local Share Account statewide grant. Councilwoman Schilling opposed.

#### Discuss Resolution #2025-52 - Lease Agreement with Bucks County - Samuel Pierce Library

Upon a motion by Bomboy, seconded by Worthington, Council unanimously approved Resolution #2025-52, a resolution of the Council of the Borough of Perkasie approving the lease agreement between the County of Bucks and Perkasie Borough for the purpose of leasing the real property known as the Samuel Pierce branch of the Bucks County Free Library System and authorizing the Borough Manager to execute the new 40-year lease on behalf of the Borough of Perkasie.

### <u>Consider Resolution #2025-53 – Cedar Ridge Estates – Release of Professional Services Escrow and 18-</u> Month Maintenance Bond

Upon a motion by Weaver, seconded by Rose, Council approved Resolution #2025-53, a resolution of the Perkasie Borough Council authorizing the release of any funds contained in the 18-month maintenance bond and any funds contained in the professional services escrow for the Cedar Ridge subdivision project, and authorizing the signature of the Borough Manager on the releases and close out of the account.

#### **PUBLIC FORUM**

Stephen Nathan of 813 Shadywood Drive informed Council that he was just made aware that the developer of the Starbucks sold the property to another property owner in Plymouth Meeting in the last 60 days.

The Borough Manager informed Mr. Nathan that the developer has communicated to the Borough that several Starbucks projects have been cancelled, but the one in the Borough has been paused, not cancelled. The developer is interested in looking for a tenant who might move faster than Starbucks, but Starbucks has not cancelled.

Councilman Faulkner commented that The Mill was recently purchased for \$300,000, and Ms. Coaxum informed him that the Borough has a meeting set up with the new property owner this month.

## MINUTES OF PERKASIE BOROUGH SPECIAL FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING-BUDGET 2026 OCT. 20, 2025

The Finance Committee meeting started at 4:00PM and Councilman Bomboy led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### PUBLIC FORUM

None

### PROPOSED BUDGET CHANGES

The Finance Director provided the following documents to the committee:

- <u>2026 Draft Budget Variances</u> a list of changes that have been made to the draft budget that were discussed during the September 22<sup>nd</sup> and October 6<sup>th</sup> committee meetings.
- <u>Electric Fund Balance Clarification</u> provides an explanation of how the fund balance for the electric fund has been calculated and the changes made to that calculation to free up funds that should not be included to meet the fund balance requirement.

The Finance Director summarized for the committee that the fund balance calculation for the electric fund had included operating expenses, capital expenditures and transfers out to other funds. However, the fund balance policy is specific that the required balance should be 14% of operating expenses only. Essentially, the electric fund's fund balance is overstated by approximately \$542,542.00. These savings will be used to help balance the 2026 budget.

The Finance Director shared a Power Point presentation with the committee.

- The first slide showed a comparison of the original Draft budget that was presented on 9/22/25 compared to the current Draft budget with all the proposed changes.
- The second and third slides showed the change in the fund balance calculations with the proposed changes.
- The fourth slide highlighted the electric fund balance calculation.
- The fifth slide listed the following proposed changes to revenue:
  - 1. Small increase of \$1,060.00 in real estate tax revenue based on the current county assessment.
  - 2. An increase of \$465,800 in the sale of electricity by passing through the increase in installed capacity. The impact on the residents would be an additional .0089¢ per kWh.
  - 3. A decrease of \$8,722 for the contribution from Sellersville for Police Services. Any changes in expenses impact the contribution.
  - The remaining slides showed the changes in the expenses as follows:
    - 1. Auditing Services decreased by \$7,000
    - 2. Police IT Services decreased by \$25,016
    - 3. Costs related to the Peaking Project decreased by \$40,000
    - 4. Savings for transformer replacement project increased by \$59,300
    - 5. Pool Pumps/Feature Replacements were decreased by \$20,600
    - 6. Actual expenses for Health & Dental came in \$48,399 less than anticipated
    - 7. Actual expenses for Property & Liability Insurance came in \$28,194 less than expected.
    - 8. Actual expenses for Worker's Compensation Insurance were \$16,130 higher than expected.
    - 9. Life Insurance increased by \$2,020

There are additional changes not included in this recent draft that are being recommended as listed below:

- Additional revenue totaling \$90,000 for the resale of older equipment.
- Potential increase in Menlo House Rent which would generate an additional \$3,678/ year.
- An additional expense of \$15,830 for the installation of a gate at the recycling center.
- Fencing to help delineate the property line between the Library and Menlo House \$3,840
- Inclusion of Borough Manager CPI Increase per the contract \$2,640

All these proposed changes ensure that the budget remains balanced and even generates a surplus of approximately \$140,000.

Ms. Schilling asked what we currently have set aside for the transformer replacement project.

The Finance Director stated that at the end of 2025 we will have saved \$300,000. We recommend setting aside an additional \$159,300 in 2026 for a total of \$459,300.

There was further discussion amongst the committee about the best way to prepare for the replacement of the transformers.

Mr. Bomboy summarized the potential surplus of \$140,000 and commented that the draft still includes the \$109,000 expense for the Community Resource Officer. He reminded everyone that funding for that position comes from a grant that has not been awarded yet.

The Borough Manager commented that if we do not receive the grant, we would have to recommend to Council to use the projected budget excess to cover the expense.

Mr. Bomboy is recommending that the projected excess should be used to lower electricity rates so that the net increase in their electric bills will be closer to 2.9%. This increase is more in line with the current CPI for electric.

There was further discussion amongst the committee about electric rates.

Council Vice-President Brooks convened the meeting at 7:00 PM. An invocation was given by Mayor Hollenbach, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### PROCLAMATION: NO RAZORS FOR NOVEMBER

Mayor Hollenbach read a Proclamation to support No Razors for November and fundraising efforts for Pennridge FISH.

# PUBLIC HEARING – CONSIDER DRAFT ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 180 OF CODE OF ORDINANCES

A Public Hearing was held to consider the adoption of an ordinance that would amend the provisions of Chapter 180 of the Perkasie Borough Code related to parking regulations by adding no parking regulations on a portion of West Market Street and South Ninth Street. The ordinance and Public Hearing were advertised appropriately, and letters were mailed to surrounding property owners with copies of the ordinance.

Ken Scary from 301 West Market Street shared his concerns about the draft ordinance and stated that this could create a hardship for them by eliminating a parking space on the street for one

of their tenants.

Steve Algeo from 400 South Ninth Street stated that he is opposed to the ordinance and that it seems we would be inconveniencing people without really adding a great benefit. Mr. Algeo suggested that a better solution could be to make it a 4-way stop, to make it one way from Ninth Street back to Eighth Street and out to Park Avenue, or to add a raised pedestrian crossing on the south side of the intersection. Mr. Algeo appreciates the speed limit being lowered to 25 mph, adding that it has helped, but there is still speeding going on.

Michael Kulp from 404 South Ninth Street echoed Mr. Algeo's suggestion of adding a 4-way stop sign. Mr. Kulp then stated that the heaviest traffic is in the evenings or on Saturday mornings with people going to the Recycling Center, so he suggested the possibility making it a no right turn out of the Recycling Center, forcing people to go down Eighth Street and exit out to Park Avenue the other way.

Donna from 305 West Market Street expressed concerns about a blind spot coming up the hill and people travelling at a great rate of speed, adding that there are a lot of children and pedestrians walking to the park. She suggested a 4-way stop could be added, or that the Borough could make Market Street one-way heading down the hill to the park, or the hill could be eliminated altogether by making that a park entrance to make it safer for kids and people on e-bikes and scooters. She added that the pickleball courts bring a lot of traffic. She also suggested speed humps might slow people down.

Danielle Pasternak from 302 West Market Street informed Council that they have been living in the Borough for almost 10 years, and the corner has continued to grow with more tenants and multiplexes, and more and more cars there, adding that her family does not always have a place to park; the houses closer to 4<sup>th</sup> Street have the alley behind the houses where they can park, but she and her family do not have that option. Ms. Pasternak stated that it has gotten more difficult over the years to find parking on the street, and that she cannot imagine how much more difficult it's going to be if parking spaces are eliminated from the street, especially for some of the elderly residents on the street.

Michael from 302 West Market Street stated that while he can understand the point of increasing the sight lines, he has witnessed people flying up and down the road, so he is concerned that increasing the sight lines will increase the confidence of those who already speed up and down the street to see that no one is coming and just continue to fly down the road. He suggested other solutions such as a 4-way stop or raised crosswalk could work better and added that he knows additional data would have to be collected.

Sue Bower from 413 South Ninth Street stated that she appeared before Council a few months ago and was in favor of lowering the speed limit on Ninth Street. She stated she has a driveway and does not need on-street parking, but needs to be able to get out of her driveway safely. Ms. Bower's concern is that taking away 85' will take away parking for 3-5 cars. Outside of normal business hours, you have a lot of people parking there, and sometimes, commercial trucks park there overnight, which is a problem. She suggested perhaps a solution would be to find a place where these people could park without encroaching on the residents. Ms. Bower also stated that she sometimes has difficulty trying to safely pull out of her driveway because there can be large vehicles parked on either side of it, adding that she has to get pretty far out to be able to see. She likes the idea of a 4-way stop, or making it one way coming out of the Recycling Center.

Dan Weaver from 422 South Ninth Street expressed his concerns about eliminating the parking spaces, stating that he doesn't know what a solution is, but that he doesn't think the 85' is going to work. Mr. Weaver added that he likes the idea of the 4-way stop sign or speed humps, and stated that there needs to be done for the blatant disrespect for the speed limit in front of the police station.

Council Vice-President Brooks thanked everyone for coming out and sharing their input.

Councilwoman Schilling read four e-mails that the Council received from residents who could not attend this evening. She also shared details from a call she received from another resident voicing concerns.

The Public Hearing was closed at 7:33 pm.

Dear Zoning Hearing Board,

Thank you for considering our application for a zoning variance permitting us to hang 8 local business advertisements on the interior fence of our property.

The signs primarily help and support the few small businesses by generating exposure for them while washing their vehicles at the car wash. We charge a very nominal amount for these businesses to hang their signs as we recognize and feel the dramatic effects of the cost of doing business during the recent years of soaring inflation. This has cause a severe hardship for many small businesses, ours included.

The cost of our products and vendor services, post covid, have gone up at an alarming rate. For example a 5 gallon jug of a wash solution in 2020 was \$61, in 2025 it is now over \$105. Insurance is more than \$2,000 over what it was in 2021. Mortgage rates have spiked to over 7%. Perkasie electric bill was approximately \$600 per month in 2021, today it is over\$1,000 per month. This is only a small portion of the increased costs we are experiencing.

These increased expenses are not able to be passed onto our customers, nor do we want to pass along high costs. When we purchased the wash in 2020 wash packages ranged from \$6-\$12. We have kept costs from \$6-\$15. Our commitment to the community and our customers is to provide a good and affordable service. Recently this has become more and more difficult.

Furthermore, year after year, we have contributed tens of thousands of dollars to sponsoring local civic activities such as the major sponsor for Under The Stars Car Show, year after year, The Christmas Tree Lighting, Pennridge Little League, Community Day, Good Time Motortvators, the Perkasie Fire Company, Harelys Haven, the Rotary Club as well as providing car washes to the Perkasie Police at cost (with increased product cost we actually do not even break even on this civic charity). This list does not include the host of various one off sponsorships we commit to as they are presented to us. Without the small income we derive

from these signs, there is no fiscal way that we will be able to continue to sponsor these activities.

We graciously ask that you consider all these variables when making your decision on our zoning variance application.

The CCRS was invited by Senator Coleman's office to be a speaker at the Senior Scam Jam event alongside representatives from the Lehigh County District Attorney's office, AARP, and the PA Attorney General's Office. This event was designed to help educate seniors on scams and to prevent further victimization.

#### Perkasie Fire Prevention Open House

The CCRS and Officer Fox attended the open house of Perkasie Fire Department and handed out educational materials and freebies to attendees while getting to know the community.

#### South Middle School BMX Bike Safety

The CCRS and our Traffic Safety Officer partnered with TMA Bucks to offer a bike safety presentation at South Middle School which received rave reviews by the students while promoted safety on our streets.

## Local Share Account Grant 2025

This year, Perkasie Borough and the police department wanted to put a strong emphasis on safety for our streets and public events. In pursuit of this goal, the CCRS was tasked with writing a new Local Share Account (LSA) Grant for the 2025 application period. The grant application this year is requesting \$386,640 to obtain two 72 unit trailers of the Mobile Vehicle Barrier Systems (MVB3X). These trailers are designed to easily transport and install the MVB3X system for community events and other road closures incidents. This system is designed and tested to prevent the unauthorized access of vehicles in numerous size ranges and configurations. By utilizing the MVB3X system, the police department will be able to quickly and easily secure our streets against unauthorized access both intentional and accidental. In addition to keeping our residents safer, we also hope to enable more public events while decreasing the amount of man hours needed to service the events. It is our hope that this grant will allow for further economic development and an increased sense of safety for many years to come!

Mr. Franks briefly reviewed the MIPP Fund and explained that those permit costs had been increased a few years ago to cover the costs of engineering inspections, reports, and sampling.

#### **ENGINEER'S REPORT**

A. Change order request from Blooming Glen Contractors for a temporary rental UV Unit.

Mr. Morgan discussed the change order request in the packet. Due to the grant reimbursements the board decided to do a Resolution to approve the change order so that the reimbursement can be submitted to the state. Mr. Franks informed the board that one reimbursement request for the UV Unit equipment had already been received.

B. Letter dated September 11, 2025 to Mr. Kevin Franks, PWTA Manager, from Mr. Alfred Ciottoni, PWTA Engineer, regarding Contracts No. 9 & 10: Ultraviolet Disinfection Upgrade Contractors' Payment Certification.

Mr. Morgan reviewed the payment request submitted by Blooming Glen Contractors and PSI Pumping Solutions for their work on the UV Unit.

Mr. Morgan also informed the board that the NPDES Permit had been published in early September and once accepted we would be issued for a new 5-year term. Lastly, Mr. Morgan discussed that he had completed new MIPP Permits and that the EPA inspection went well last year.

#### **MANAGER'S REPORT**

Mr. Franks reported that there was one violation for fecal coliform instantaneous max on the Authority's NPDES Permit for the month of August 2025. The recorded rainfall for August was 2.54". The single highest daily flow was 3.0 MGD, with a monthly average flow reported at 1.8 MGD.

Mr. Franks also reported that the temporary UV Unit was installed, the contractors were waiting for two valves and then the electrical contractors will start their work. Once the electrical is done, Xylem will come in to do a test run on the temporary unit. Then the old unit will be deconstructed so work can begin on the new unit.

Mr. Franks discussed that the grit chamber had been cleaned out and that the grit chamber auger will be replaced as part of this year's capital projects. He also discussed a blower motor failed in one of the aeration tanks.

# PERKASIE BOROUGH 2025 ROADWAY CONDITION SURVEY

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#### I. PURPOSE

The intent of the 2025 Roadway Condition Survey is to provide the Borough of Perkasie with a current assessment of the existing roadway conditions and to provide recommendations for future roadway repair projects. This document can be used as a guide to help the Borough effectively and efficiently allocate available funding, such as Liquid Fuels Funds, for both current and future roadway repairs. Gilmore & Associates, Inc. (G&A) has prepared this report to assist the Borough with prioritizing annual roadway repairs by maximizing available funding while improving the overall condition and safety of their local roadways for its residents and the general public.

Appendix C of this report includes a recommended 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan intended to provide the Borough with the opportunity to coordinate future public improvement projects, such as the annual Road Program, Concrete Program, stormwater improvements, etc., as well as, other future projects scheduled by Residents, Developers, PennDOT, and/or local utility service providers. However, it is important to note that the actual roadway repairs completed each year may deviate from the recommended 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan due to budgetary constraints and unforeseen circumstances. Utilizing a Roadway Reconstruction Plan will ultimately help the Borough better preserve their infrastructure investment.

Please note that this report is a comprehensive document that requires regular updates to the roadway condition ratings and estimated unit costs. Due to the variety of weather conditions experienced in this region, we recommend that the Borough continue to conduct field surveys to visually inspect the entire Borough maintained roadway system at a minimum of every two (2) to three (3) years following the completion of the annual Road Program.

#### II. PAVEMENT CONDITION RATINGS AND ROADWAY SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The pavement condition rating methodology utilized to assess the condition of the Borough's roadways is based on the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) *Guide for Design of Pavement Structures*. The guide defines the design life stages of a bituminous roadway using condition ratings from 1 through 5. Figure No. 1 shown on the following page helps to illustrate each roadway condition rating. The figure demonstrates that a roadway typically deteriorates linearly over time until a certain point. Once the roadway reaches this point, the rate of deterioration accelerates exponentially. The rate of deterioration of a roadway is based on a combination of factors including by not limited to the structural integrity of the roadway, traffic volume loading and climate changes (i.e. freeze/thaw).

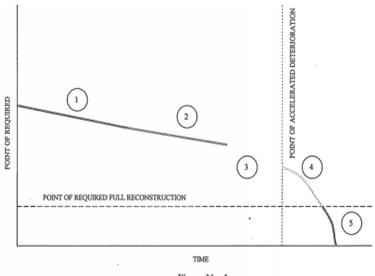

As shown in Figure No. 1, Conditions 1 and 2 roadways are considered to be in fairly good condition or recently paved; Condition 3 is the stage where the roadway surface begins the process of deterioration; Condition 4 is the stage where accelerated deterioration of the roadway begins; and Condition 5 is the stage where the roadway typically requires full reconstruction. Please note that in preparation of this survey, Conditions 3 and 4 have been divided into sub-ratings (3, 3.5, 4 and 4.5) to better assess the condition of the roadway and define the rate of deterioration. Detailed descriptions and photographic examples of each roadway condition rating have been provided in Appendix A of this report.

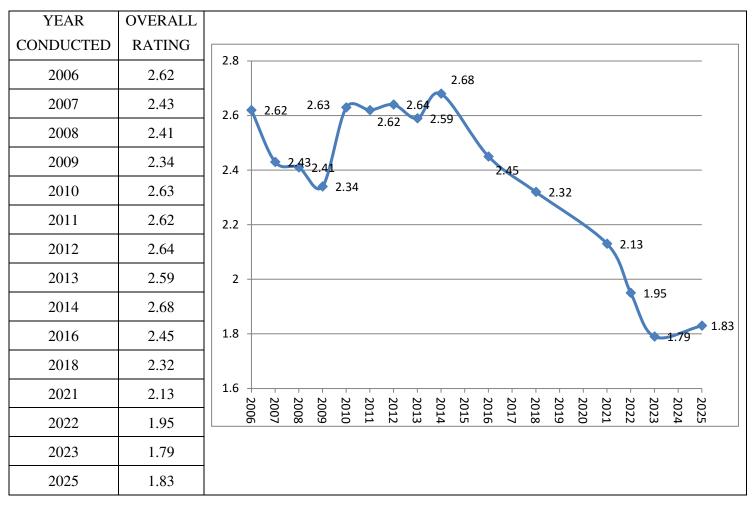
The 2025 Roadway Condition Survey has been prepared using data collected during a field survey and inspection performed by Gilmore & Associates, Inc. and the Public Works Director on October 7, 2025. During the field survey, every road within the Borough limits was visually inspected and assigned a numeric rating between 1 and 5 based on the AASHTO Guide for Design of Pavement Structures described above. A summary of the 2025 Roadway Condition Ratings can be found in Appendix B of this report.

#### III. **OVERALL ROADWAY CONDITION RATING**

The Overall Roadway Condition Rating is a calculated numerical value based on the pavement conditions and length of each individual roadway within the Borough. This rating is used to compare the current conditions of the roadways to the conditions of previous years. The overall condition rating can be a useful tool to determine how a combination of factors such as weather or construction projects can impact the degradation of the roadways. The goal is to achieve and maintain the lowest possible overall condition rating; by doing so, the Borough will ultimately spend less money to maintain their roadways. Funds can be allocated to lower cost maintenance and repairs, such as crack sealing or mill and overlay, as opposed to the more costly maintenance, such as base repair and complete reconstruction.

The 2025 Roadway Condition Survey indicates that the Borough's roadways achieved an overall condition rating of 1.83, which represents a slight increase from the 2023 overall condition rating but the second-best overall condition rating observed in the past 19 years. The considerable improvement of the overall condition rating is a result of the Borough's proactive approach to the road programs combined with the milder winter weather and temperatures observed over the last 11 years. By utilizing an aggressive financial schedule and a strategic approach to prioritize the repair of roadways assigned a Condition Rating of 4, 4.5 or 5 during the 2014 through 2025 Road Programs, the Borough has reversed the deterioration trend and substantially improved the overall roadway condition rating.

PERKASIE BOROUGH ANNUAL OVERALL ROADWAY CONDITION RATING SUMMARY



The summary of the Borough's Overall Roadway Condition Ratings provided above was prepared based on the field surveys conducted from 2006 to 2025 and roadways completed in 2022 and 2023. The ratings were summarized using field survey date conducted by Gilmore & Associates, Inc., as well as utilizing previous editions of this report, as prepared by Boucher & James, Inc. and CKS Engineers, Inc. Please note that based on the results of the annual ratings reported, the Borough requested in 2014 that the Roadway Condition Survey report only be updated once every two years. However, due to the mild winter weather and temperatures, four years have passed since the previous field survey was completed on August 31, 2021.

#### IV. <u>FINDINGS</u>

Based on the results of the 2025 Roadway Condition Survey, the 2025 Roadway Condition Rating Summary graphic provided below demonstrates that approximately half of the Borough owned roadways have been assigned a Condition Rating of 1 and approximately 92.3% of the roadways have been classified as a Condition 3 Rating or better. Please note that the color for each percentage in the chart below matches the colors assigned to each roadway condition rating on the Roadway Condition Map provided in Appendix D.

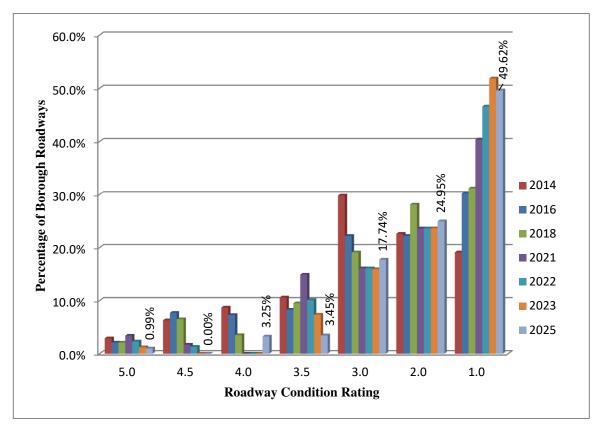

The Year 2014 vs. Year 2016 vs. Year 2018 vs. Year 2021 vs. Year 2022 vs. Year 2023 vs Year 2025 Condition Rating Comparison table on the following page demonstrates considerable changes in the percentages of roadways rated as Conditions 1, 3.5, 4.5, and 5. The shift in the roadway condition rating percentages can be attributed to the Borough's proactive approach to include roadways of varying condition ratings into their annual road program. By annually completing the maintenance and repair of roadways with varying condition ratings, the Borough will ultimately spend less money to maintain their roadway infrastructure. For example, focusing solely on repairing the Condition 5 roadways will limit the number of roadways that can be completed in any given year. In addition, repairing only the Condition 5 roadways will result in the further deterioration of the Condition 3 to 4.5 roadways and negatively impact the Borough's Overall Roadway Condition Rating.

Based on historical observation data, a roadway rated as Condition 3.5 can rapidly deteriorate to a Condition 4, 4.5 or 5 within a year depending on the volume of traffic experienced by the roadway and weather conditions. Therefore, the overall improvement of the individual roadway condition ratings in the year 2025 does not discount the continued need for future improvements to the Condition 3.5 to Condition 5 rated roadways which account for approximately 7.7% of the Borough owned roadways.

The 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan provided in Appendix C recommends both short-term and long-term schedule of roadway repairs which are intended to improve the Borough's Overall Roadway Condition Rating. Even though approximately 92.3 percent of the Borough owned roadways are rated as a Condition 3 or better, the 5 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan still recommends an aggressive yet strategic roadway selection for future road programs. The recommended goal is to repair Condition 3.5 through Condition 5 rated roadways while still incorporating maintenance and repair of Condition 3 rated roadways in localized areas of the Borough.

Please note that the 2025 Roadway Condition Rating and 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan provided in Appendix B and C respectively, also include an estimated cost of repair based on the square yard and condition rating of each individual roadway. The estimated costs have been prepared by comparing the unit costs received by the Borough from previous Road Program bids, as well as recent unit costs received by local municipalities.

#### V. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The results of the 2025 Roadway Condition Survey indicate a minor increase in the Borough's Overall Roadway Condition Rating since the 2023 update but an improvement since the 2021 Roadway Condition Survey. Although the majority of the Borough owned roadways were found to be in acceptable condition (Condition 3 or better), we note that there was also a higher percentage of roadways that have deteriorated to a Condition Rating of 4.

As indicated in the 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan in Appendix C, we recommend a combination of Condition 3, 3.5 and 4 rated roadways be the primary selection for the 2026 through 2030 Road Programs in order to continue improving the Borough's overall roadway condition rating.

Overall, we recommend that the Borough continue to implement an aggressive schedule of Condition 3.5, 4 and 5 rated roadways for future road repair projects dependent on the amount of available funding. Based on the recommended 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan provided in Appendix C, all of the roadways currently rated as Condition 4 and 5 will be repaired by the year 2028. This strategy will allow the Borough to mitigate the roadways currently rated as Condition 4 while also proactively preventing the Condition 3.5 rated roadways from deteriorating to a Condition 5 Rating status.

Please note that this report is a comprehensive document that requires updates and modifications to the condition ratings and estimated unit costs. Due to the variety of weather conditions experienced throughout the year in this region, we recommend that the Borough continue to conduct a field survey and visual inspection of all of the Borough's roadways at a minimum of every two (2) to three (3) years during the summer or fall months. We further recommend that an updated report be provided to Borough Council in the fall in order to incorporate the recommended roadway repair projects into the budget for the upcoming year. Once the Borough determines the scope and budget of the annual Road Program, the residents will have to be notified if there are any required curb and/or sidewalk improvements associated with the upcoming roadway repairs.

Please be aware that the intent of the 2025 Roadway Condition Survey is to provide the Borough with an understanding of the existing conditions of their roadways and a recommendation for future projects. This report should be used as a guide to help the Borough set their roadway repair goals and to determine the most effective and efficient allocation of available funding. It is also important to note that the actual roadway repairs completed each year may deviate from the recommended 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan due to budgetary constraints and unforeseen circumstances.

#### **ROADWAY CONDITION RATINGS DESCRIPTIONS AND EXAMPLES**

Condition 3 or 3.5 roadways appear to be deteriorating on the surface and potentially other pavement layers and require action to prevent further degradation. The roadway base and subbase are typically intact and in an acceptable condition. The roadway surface and potentially other pavement layers may have areas of rutting, linear surface cracking and minimal isolated potholes and areas of potential spalling. Note that the roadways in the pictures to the right have numerous linear surface cracks that were previously sealed; however additional cracks continue to form. No alligator cracking has developed on either roadway which suggests that the roadway has an adequate base and subbase structure.

Repairs for a Condition 3 or 3.5 roadway include resurfacing (i.e. mill and overlay) and the completion of isolated pavement repair caused by potholes or localized spalling. If addressed in a timely and effective manner, these repairs can help prevent a Condition 3 or 3.5 roadway from deteriorating to a Condition 4 or Condition 5 rating, which may require a significant amount of pavement and base repair or possibly complete roadway reconstruction.

The estimated cost associated with the repair of a Condition 3 roadway is \$21.20 per square yard and \$22.80 per square yard for a condition 3.5 roadway as shown in the Roadway Condition Rating and the recommended 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan provided in Appendix B and C.

Based on the total linear feet of Borough roadways, approximately 17.74% of the roadways have been rated as Condition 3 and 3.45% have been rated as Condition 3.5.

#### **ROADWAY CONDITION RATINGS DESCRIPTIONS AND EXAMPLES**

Condition Number 4 or 4.5 roadways appear to have almost completely deteriorated at the surface and consists of damage that extends into the subbase which requires action to prevent the need for full reconstruction. The roadway surface, other pavement layers have numerous areas of severe rutting, linear surface cracking, alligator cracking, major areas of spall, several potholes and areas of exposed pavement base. Note that the roadways in the pictures to the right have numerous areas of linear surface cracking, spalling and exposed subbase.

Repairs for a Condition 4 or 4.5 roadway include resurfacing (i.e. mill and overlay) along with a significant amount of both pavement and base repairs. It is important to note that a Condition 4.5 rating represents a roadway or area of a roadway that has been deemed most critical for attention to prevent reaching a Condition 5 rating. If addressed in a timely and effective manner, these repairs can prevent a Condition 4 or 4.5 roadway from deteriorating to a Condition 5 rating, which may require complete roadway reconstruction.

The estimated cost associated with the repair of a Condition 4 roadway is \$32.70 per square yard and \$33.40 per square yard for a condition 4.5 roadway as shown in the Roadway Condition Rating and the recommended 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan provided in Appendix B and C.

Based on the total linear feet of Borough roadways, approximately 3.25% of the roadways have been rated as Condition 4 and 0.0% have been rated as Condition 4.5.

# CONDITION 5 MAJOR BASE REPAIR

#### **ROADWAY CONDITION RATINGS DESCRIPTIONS AND EXAMPLES**

Condition 5 roadways appear to have areas of severe rutting, alligator cracking, major areas spalling, and numerous potholes or other areas of exposed pavement base. These types of conditions indicate that the damage to the roadway surface course extends through the subbase. Note that the roadways in the pictures to the right have severe alligator cracking and a significant amount of exposed base course and subbase.

Repairs for a Condition 5 roadway include resurfacing (i.e. mill and overlay) along with an extensive amount of both pavement and base repairs along the entire roadway. A road categorized as Condition Number 5 requires attention from the Borough as soon as funds are available.

The estimated cost associated with the repair of a Condition 5 roadway is \$45.40 per square yard as shown in the Roadway Condition Rating and the recommended 5 to 15 Year Roadway Reconstruction Plan provided in Appendix B and C.

Based on the total linear feet of Borough roadways, approximately 0.99% of the roadways have been rated as Condition 5.

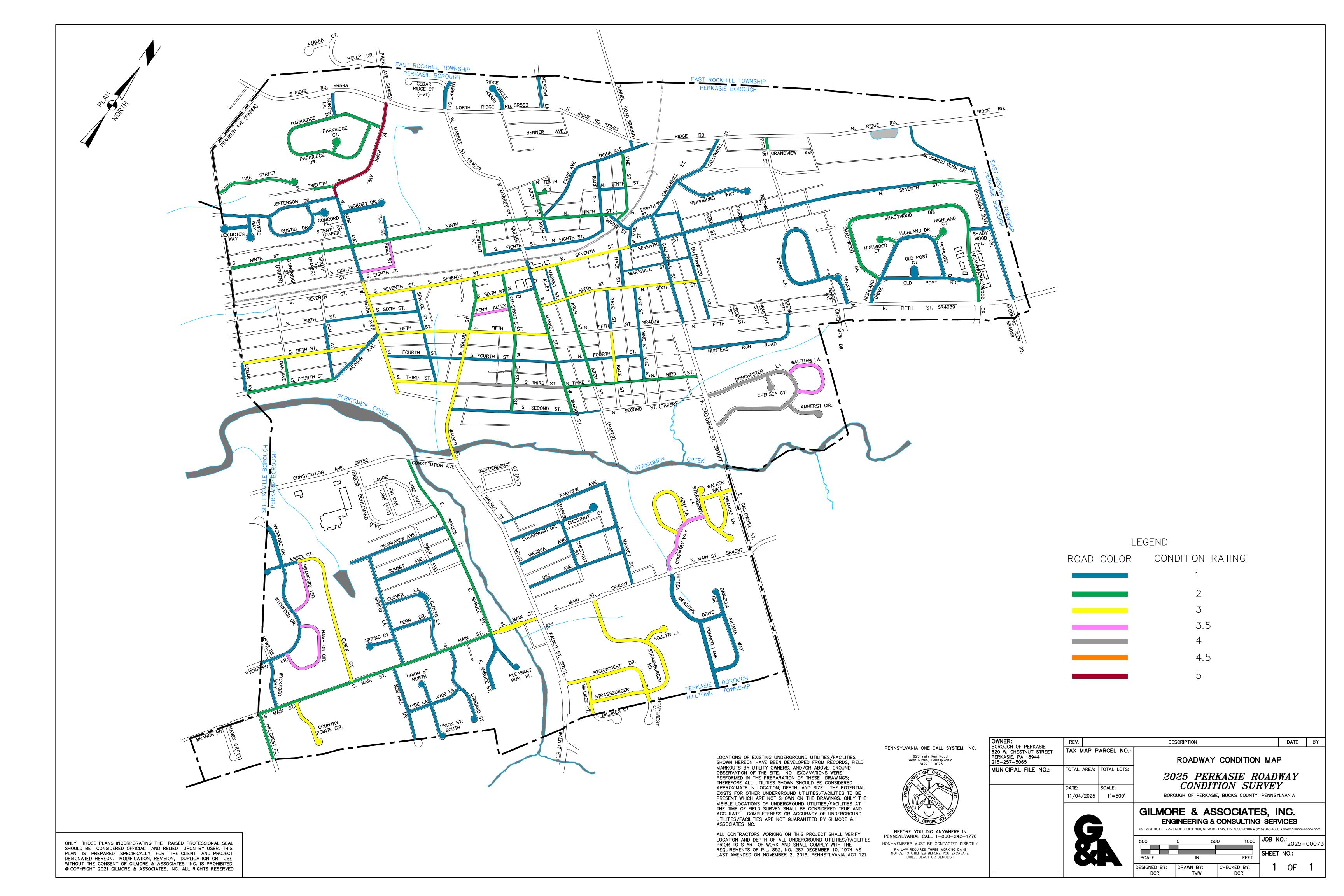

Perkasie Borough seeks to modernize its Public Works fleet by replacing an aging 2012 dump truck and outdated tow-behind leaf vacuum with a new 2026 Freightliner 108SD Plus multi-purpose hook truck. The project will address safety, efficiency, and environmental challenges in the Borough's leaf collection, snow removal, and recycling programs. The current equipment is costly to maintain, requires excessive staffing, and contributes to roadway hazards and stormwater pollution. The new truck and equipment will reduce labor hours, improve salt and leaf management, eliminate leased hauling costs, and expand the vehicle's year-round use for hauling recyclables and yard waste—strengthening the Borough's compliance with Act 101 recycling and MS4 stormwater mandates.

# **Project Description:**

Hook Truck: Ensuring the Sustainability, Efficiency, and Safety of Perkasie Borough's Recycling and Road Maintenance Programs

### **Project Summary**

Perkasie Borough is requesting \$435,503.25 from the Pennsylvania Local Share Account (Statewide) grant program to purchase a 2026 Freightliner 108SD Plus truck, upfitted with a Swap Loader SL330 hook system, a Flink V-Box Spreader, a Dinkmar One-Man Hook Lift Leaf Vacuum, and a Falls Power Reversible E-2 Model PR1043 Snow Plow. This vehicle will replace a 2012 International WorkStar dump truck nearing the end of its service life and will significantly improve the Borough's ability to maintain streets, manage stormwater, and operate its recycling center safely and efficiently.

This multi-purpose truck will support year-round operations—performing leaf collection, snow and ice control, and hauling of recyclables and yard waste—while reducing operational costs, improving staff safety, and enhancing compliance with environmental regulations.

### **Project Background and Need**

The Borough's existing 2012 WorkStar dump truck is approaching the end of its 15-year service life and currently supports only limited operations—primarily leaf collection and snow removal. It is equipped with a 1997 tow-behind leaf vacuum and an outdated salt spreader, both of which are inefficient, unsafe, and environmentally problematic.

- Leaf Vacuum: Requires three crew members to operate manually curbside, exposing them to safety risks and traffic hazards. Maintenance and repair costs are high, and the aging system no longer meets operational or safety standards.
- Salt Spreader: The existing unit distributes salt inconsistently, creating hazardous roadway conditions and increasing chloride pollution in stormwater runoff.
- Limited Use: The truck sits idle for nearly half the year, reducing its value to taxpayers and limiting operational flexibility.

Meanwhile, the Borough's Recycling Drop-Off Center presents additional challenges. Residents must climb metal stairs to deposit recyclables into tall open-top containers, posing safety risks during rain, snow, and ice. Open containers invite contamination from non-recyclable materials such as playground equipment and construction debris, increasing disposal costs. The Borough currently leases these

containers and contracts for third-party hauling—an arrangement that will cost \$26,650 in 2025, a 19% increase over 2024.

### **Scope of Work and Improvements**

The project includes the purchase and upfitting of a 2026 Freightliner 108SD Plus with a Swap Loader SL330 hook lift system, enabling the truck to quickly change attachments for different operations. The grant will also fund:

- Dinkmar One-Man Single Axle Hook Lift Leaf Vacuum
  - Reduces leaf collection to a one-person operation, eliminating the need for two additional crew members.
  - o Improves safety by allowing operation from the truck cab instead of curbside.
  - Saves an estimated 591 staff hours annually, translating to \$97,244 in salary savings over five years.
- Flink V-Box Spreader and Falls Power Reversible Plow
  - o Provides even, precise salt application to prevent piles and reduce waste.
  - o Improves roadway safety and minimizes sodium chloride entering the stormwater system.
- Three Truck-Compatible Containers for Recycling and Yard Waste
  - o Two closed-top 21-cubic-yard containers for comingled recycling.
  - One open-top 29-cubic-yard container for yard waste.
  - Eliminates annual rental and hauling fees, saving an estimated \$29,315 in 2026 and nearly \$29,000 per year thereafter.
  - Covered design allows residents to safely deposit recyclables from ground level, addressing insurance safety concerns and reducing contamination.

Collectively, the improvements will extend vehicle use to all twelve months, create significant operational savings, and greatly enhance operational flexibility.

### **Environmental and Programmatic Benefits**

The project directly supports Pennsylvania DEP mandates under Act 101 (municipal recycling) and the MS4 Stormwater Program. Leaf collection is a recognized Best Management Practice (BMP) under MS4 compliance, preventing nutrient and sediment pollution from entering storm drains. Likewise, improved salt spreader precision reduces chloride runoff, protecting aquatic habitats and downstream water quality.

The closed-top recycling containers will improve waste stream purity and lower landfill disposal costs - advancing the Commonwealth's goal to divert waste and reduce contamination.

### **Financial and Operational Impact**

By replacing outdated equipment and consolidating multiple functions into a single multi-purpose vehicle, Perkasie Borough will achieve measurable financial, safety, and environmental outcomes:

SUBJECT: SHELLY'S SIGN – REPLACEMENT AND POTENTIAL USE OF BOROUGH ELECTRIC

Perkasie Borough received an application from MRC Signs on behalf of Shelly Ent Inc. for a permit to replace the Shelly's sign located at the corner of S. 7<sup>th</sup> St and W. Market St, and to replace the sign on the façade of the Shelly's building. Drawings of the proposed replacement signs are attached to this memo.

The proposed freestanding sign at the corner of 7<sup>th</sup> & Market is backlit, and requires electric supply. The Borough's Electric Supervisor has review the sign specifications and estimates that the cost of electric supply to the new sign, lit for around 5 hours per day (dusk until midnight) would be approximately \$18 per annum. Perkasie Borough already has electric supply to the location.

I'm sharing this information and asking that Borough Council discuss whether they wish to create an agreement with the property owner to provide electric supply for the sign at no cost. It would save the costs to the Borough of adding a meter to the electric supply, and Perkasie's events would continue to use the space and the electric supply at this location for the benefit of the community.

# PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT October 2025

#### **RECREATION**

SUBJECT: Lenape Park Softball Shed

The Lenape Park softball shed was installed many years ago and has withstood two significant floods in recent years. Made of wood, the shed stores equipment used for maintaining the softball field, as well as bases and other field-use items. After years of use and repeated flooding, the shed is now deteriorating.

This year, we reached out to Univest for support in replacing the shed. Univest, who rents the field annually for their company softball games, has generously approved a donation of \$1,750 toward a new shed.

The cost of a new vinyl shed from Elite Outdoor Structures is approximately \$3,055. We did receive three quotes even though not required through the purchasing policy because this expense was not included in the 2025 budget. With Univest's donation, I am requesting that Council approve the additional \$1,305 needed to complete the purchase and installation this year.

Currently, there is \$5,400 remaining in the Wood Chips/Playground Mulch budget line. Jeff has suggested using this line to cover the remaining cost, as he does not plan to purchase additional wood chips this year.

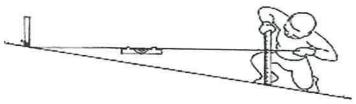

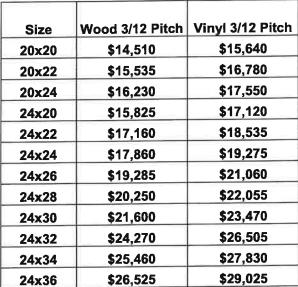

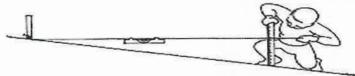

Attached you will find the summary sheets for the 2026 Preliminary Budget. The Preliminary Budget includes the changes that were discussed at the Finance Committee meeting on October 20th. In summary, the total revenue is \$1,895K (7.6%) higher than the 2025 Budget and spending is \$2,622K (10.8%) higher than the 2025 Budget.

The major changes to the budget are as follows:

### **General Fund**

Spending is increasing by 6.1% due primarily to the increase in contractual wages and rising benefit costs. The preliminary budget maintains the current tax rate, with no increases proposed for 2026.

#### **Menlo Fund**

Revenue is decreasing by 9.5% and spending is increasing by 2.9%. The Menlo Aquatics Center experienced a strong 2025 season. Despite the need for a budgeted transfer from the Electric Fund to balance operations and meet fund balance requirements, improved revenue performance and careful expense management eliminated the need for a transfer in the 2026 preliminary budget. Staff continue to be proactive in marketing pool memberships and in providing flexible payment plans to help residents spread costs.

#### **Refuse Fund**

Expenses are increasing by 2.8%. The preliminary budget does not include any increases in toter and trash bag fees, despite rising costs for disposal, dumpster rentals and operational expenses. The Borough will maintain the same level of weekly service for residents as well.

#### **Electric Fund**

Perkasie Borough has continued to strategically manage its energy purchases. By securing block purchases in advance, the Borough locked in favorable energy pricing that meets our electric load requirements through 2028. These savings help soften the impact of rapidly rising capacity charges, which have grown significantly—from approximately \$285,000 in 2024 to \$1 million in 2025, and a projected \$1.5 million in 2026. Capacity costs are expected to remain elevated beyond 2026.

The Electric Budget outlines two potential approaches for Council's consideration regarding electric rates:

## Option 1: Installed Capacity Adjustment Only

Council may elect to apply a .0089¢ / kWh increase solely to the installed capacity line. With this option customers would see an average increase ranging from 4.1% to 6.8% on their monthly bill, depending on their rate class. This option generates additional revenue and results in an overall budget surplus of approximately \$140,000 in the Electric Fund.

## Option 2: Installed Capacity Increase with a Slight Energy Cost Decrease

Alternatively, Council may choose to offset a portion of the installed capacity increase by approving a slight decrease in energy costs of .0027¢ or .0037¢ per kWh, depending on the rate class. This option would result in a net monthly bill increase of 2.9% to 4%, which is aligned with the current CPI for energy costs. This option would eliminate the projected surplus, bringing the Electric Fund closer to a break-even position for 2026.

#### Fire Fund

Revenue and Spending are increasing by .7% based on anticipated tax revenues. The revenues generated from the Fire Tax are passed directly to the Fire Department to support essential emergency response services.

## **Road Improvement Fund**

Revenue and Spending are increasing by .2% based on anticipated tax revenues. These resources will allow Perkasie Borough Council to continue its commitment to prioritizing the upgrade and maintenance of Borough-owned roads.

#### **Capital Fund**

Revenue and Spending are increasing by 29.8% due primarily to the increase in capital purchases and projects for 2026. It is important to note that 53.5% of the funding is coming from Grants and 6.4% is coming from the existing fund balance.

#### **Highway Aid Fund**

Both Revenue and Spending are decreasing by 3.4% due to decreased funding from the State.

Gilmore & Associates Inc. (G&A) has reviewed the Escrow Release Request #6 from XTreme Flippers, LLC dated November 4, 2025. Per the Financial Security Agreement dated May 21, 2021, a financial security fund in the form of a Letter of Credit has been established by QNB Bank in the amount of \$429,063.53. This request for release of a portion of the financial security fund is for concrete monuments, iron pins and paving.

In response to the Developer's request, G&A has reviewed the completed site improvements and the items/quantities for this release are as delineated on the attached breakdown. The following items listed on the Developer's request were not approved for release:

- 1. The request to release the total amount for "As-Built Plans" (A.4) is not approved since storm sewer and stormwater management as-built plans have not been submitted for review and approval.
- 2. The request to release the total amount for "Monument Certification Letter" (A.5) is not approved since a Monument Certification Letter has not been provided to the Borough and our office.
- 3. The request to release the amount remaining for "Seed & Mulch" (D.3) is not approved since the entire site has not produced the required germination and additional seeding may be required.

G&A would recommend reducing the financial security fund by Twenty-Six Thousand Six Hundred Twelve Dollars and Ten Cents (\$26,612.10) to the amount of One Hundred Twenty-Four Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-One Dollars and Eighty-Two Cents (\$124,881.82).

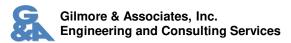

## **Budget Narrative:**

Revivals Outreach Center is requesting \$149,939.09 to purchase a fully equipped food truck.

Revivals will fund any additional costs for delivery of the vehicle, permits, licensures, etc.

**Project Narrative:** By acquiring a food truck, our nonprofit can expand services beyond our fixed location. Revivals Outreach Center believes that by mobilizing our soup kitchen and food rescue program, we will be able to impact 500-600 families each week doubling our current reach.

## What do you plan to accomplish?

Revivals is located in Perkasie, Bucks County. One of Revivals causes is Food & Basic Needs. While we have no service boundaries, we predominantly serve upper Bucks and Montgomery counties. Over the last 12 months, Revivals distributed \$1.4 million in rescued food to the community. Revivals partnered with local grocers, meat distributors, and food banks to rescue food that is still good but would otherwise be thrown away. The first week of the food rescue program we served 20 cars, each week thereafter the car line doubled. Since month 2, we have distributed groceries to 100-135 cars each Saturday valued at approx. \$27K/week. Our soup kitchen serves 140 individuals each Tuesday. Our total food program impact was \$1.7 million over the last year, including freezer meals and home delivery. The center is located on the main road and is not walkable. A food truck would allow us to mobilize our soup kitchen and food rescue program while increasing the number of food programs per week.

## How do you plan to accomplish it?

Revivals has no income requirement to receive free food. According to the United Way, 1 in 3 Bucks County and 1 in 4 Montgomery County families with children face food insecurities and fall under the ALICE/SNAP threshold. ALICE stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed. ALICE households earn more than the Federal Poverty Level but less than the basic cost of living. ALICE families generally do not qualify for SNAP benefits but often have to choose between food and utility bills. A food truck would enable Revivals to take the soup kitchen and food rescue program into the community. With a safer walk, warm meals and nutritious groceries could be distributed to substantially more families. A food truck would allow us to increase our distribution days and bring food to areas of the

community that would most benefit from a walkable food option. With a food truck and additional distribution days, Revivals would be able to put healthy food on the tables of more families.

## How do you plan to use the funds?

If funded, Revivals would purchase a fully equipped food truck in the amount of \$149,939.09. Revivals would fund all necessary expenses to acquire proper permitting and licensure. Along with our current food providers, we will expand our distributor base and acquire a steady stream of food coming in and food being redistributed to our communities. The food truck would be fully wrapped with the Revivals logo to be identifiable to the public. Revivals is committed to never having to turn anyone who is hungry away and will take measures to ensure consistency in distribution. A schedule for services will be established to be able to provide food to those in need most days of the week. The purchase of a food truck will also be available for local events such as tree lightings and National Night Out to provide free soup and other meals. In the event of a crisis or disaster, Revivals could mobilize the truck to assist with first responders and community members in need.

## **Project Schedule**

Immediately upon award, Revivals would begin the process of purchasing the food truck. The current turnaround time from award to in-service utilization is 3-4 months. There are approximately 37,133 households that fall under the ALICE or SNAP threshold in our direct service area; we are currently servicing less than .01% of them on a weekly basis with our soup kitchen and food rescue program. We believe that by mobilizing our programs and increasing distribution days and locations we can serve a significant number of additional households. If funded, Revivals will set a first-year goal of doubling the number of households benefiting from our soup kitchen and food rescue programs to complement the 25 + other programs we offer to our community.

RE: Bucket Truck Repair

At this time, I would like to ask Council to authorize an expenditure of \$15,471.79 from the 2025 Repair & Maintenance Services Line Item 07.442.370, Repair and Maintenance Services, due to an unexpected hydraulic cylinder replacement on one of our bucket trucks. The truck that needs the replacement is the newest bucket we have; it was purchased in 2021, we had a leaking cylinder last year and it was repaired by Altec, the company that built the truck. The leak reappeared in one year and is not covered under any warranty, Altec is recommending not repairing but replacing the cylinder with a new one and they are willing to reimburse the \$1,624.50 that was spent on the repairs and to put it towards the replacement cost.

While the repair and maintenance expense account is currently over budget by \$250.00, we are currently trending toward a surplus in the Electric Fund due to higher electricity sales and lower than anticipated operating expenses. A portion of the anticipated surplus can be used to cover this unexpected expense.

## PERKASIE BOROUGH ORDINANCE NO.

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PERKASIE, BUCKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING THE PERKASIE BOROUGH HISTORICAL COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Borough Code at 8 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq., authorizes the Borough Council of the Borough of Perkasie ("Borough Council") to make and adopt ordinances that are consistent with the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth when necessary for the proper management, care and control of the Borough and the maintenance of peace, good government, health and welfare of the Borough and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Perkasie, in furtherance of the authority noted previously in this ordinance, has determined to establish the Perkasie Borough Historical Committee; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council, after due consideration of the proposed ordinance at a duly advertised public meeting, has determined that the health, safety, and general welfare of the residents of Perkasie Borough will be served by this amendment to the Perkasie Code of Ordinances.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Perkasie, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of same as follows:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Establishment of Historical Committee – The Borough Council hereby establishes the Perkasie Borough Historical Committee.

SECTION 2. General Purpose – The purpose of establishing the Historical Committee is to promote the preservation and protection of historic resources in Perkasie Borough ("Borough"), since doing so enhances the interests of education, property values, and

the general welfare of the citizens of the Borough. The specific purposes of this Ordinance are as follows:

- A. To protect the integrity of the historic resources of Perkasie Borough;
- B. To establish a process by which proposed changes to historic resources are reviewed by Perkasie Borough;
- C. To encourage the continued, viable use of historic resources in Perkasie Borough;
- D. To discourage the unnecessary demolition of historic resources in Perkasie
   Borough; and
- E. To maintain the property rights of Perkasie Borough.

SECTION 3. Membership of Perkasie Borough Historical Committee - The Perkasie Borough Historical Committee shall consist of five (5) members, all of whom shall be residents of the Borough, or who conduct and operate a business in Perkasie Borough. The Historical Committee shall be appointed by Borough Council, and the membership of the Historical Committee shall, to the extent possible, include individuals who have an interest in history, archeology, or historic preservation. The terms of members of the Historical Committee shall be four (4) years, except that the terms of the members newly appointed at the time of the adoption of this Ordinance shall be fixed so that the first new member shall be appointed to a one (1) year term, the second new member shall be appointed to a two (2) year term, the third new member shall be appointed to a three (3) year term, and the fourth and fifth new members shall be appointed to four (4) year terms. The Mayor of Perkasie shall act as an ex officio member but shall not have voting rights. Members shall serve without compensation. Vacancies occurring

other than by the expiration of a term shall be for the unexpired term and shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointees.

SECTION 4. Organization of Historical Committee – Members of the Historical Committee shall elect a Chairperson and Secretary and select all necessary Officers to serve for a period of one (1) year. Perkasie Borough Council may adopt rules and regulations for the conduct of all business within the jurisdiction of the Historical Committee. The Chairperson shall help direct the activities of the Historical Committee. A majority of Members in attendance at a meeting of the Historical Committee shall constitute a quorum. The Historical Committee may make, alter, and rescind rules and forms for its procedures consistent with the Ordinances of the Borough and laws and regulations of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. To the extent necessary, the Borough Solicitor shall act as counsel to the Historical Committee. The Historical Committee shall comply, in every respect, with Pennsylvania Law, including the Sunshine Law, Open Meetings Law, Ethics Act, and the like. On an annual basis, on or before March 31st of each calendar year, the Historical Committee shall submit a report of its activities to Borough Council.

## **SECTION 5. Specific Purposes** – The Historical Committee shall:

- A. Advise the Borough on the update and revision to the Comprehensive Plan, including drafting a historic preservation plan as required under the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, pursuant to Article III, Section 301(6).
- B. Advise on the nomination of significant resources to the national Register of Historic Places and any other appropriate lists or programs.

- C. Make recommendations, in writing, to Borough Council concerning revisions, updates, or corrections to a Historic Resource Map or Inventory on an annual basis or more frequently as deemed necessary by the Historical Committee. The map or inventory shall conform to standards recommended by the Pennsylvania State Historical Commission.
- D. Maintain an updated list which clearly identifies buildings, sites, structures, objects, and districts and their respective classifications on a Historic Resource Map or Inventory. The list shall conform to standards recommended by the Pennsylvania State Historical Commission.
- E. Advise the Zoning Officer and Borough Council on the issuance of demolition permits for historic resources.
- F. Review and comment, and where necessary make recommendations on subdivision or land development applications which include historic resources, in accordance with the requirements of the Perkasie Borough Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance, and the Municipalities Planning Code.
- G. Collect and disseminate data and information on matters of historic significance in Perkasie Borough.
- H. Publish pamphlets and reports designating historic sites or buildings of significant value to the history of Perkasie Borough.
- I. Cooperate with any qualified historical society in investigations of historical matters relating to Perkasie Borough.

- J. Recommend to Borough Council a suitable depositary and display of historical papers, documents and relics.
- K. Advise Borough Council and/or the Zoning Hearing Board on all requests for conditional uses, special exceptions, or variances involving historic resources.
- L. Review applications for the rehabilitation, enlargement, or alteration of historic resources and advise Borough Council with respect thereto.
- M. To make recommendations to Borough Council, as permitted by law under Section 1202 of the Pennsylvania Borough Code, which respect to the appropriation of any funds of the Borough for the observation of any holidays or centennials, or other anniversaries for Borough celebrations or other civic projects or programs.
- N. Advise Borough Council on Historic Preservation awards, Historical Markers, Military Banners, and other efforts to foster awareness and appreciation of the Borough's history, including efforts to celebrate Borough's anniversaries.
- O. The Committee may utilize volunteers to assist Committee members in accomplishing the activities listed above and any other activities that the Committee undertakes.

**SECTION 6. Expenses of Historical Committee** – The Historical Committee shall not be authorized to spend any funds in the absence of approval for same by Borough Council. Furthermore, the Historical Committee shall be advisory in nature and shall have no

authority to make any decisions with respect to issues associated with the Historical Committee's directions within the Borough, as that responsibility rests solely with Borough Council.

SECTION 7. Meetings of Historical Committee – The Historical Committee shall hold an organizational meeting in January of each year. Officers as noted previously in this Ordinance shall be elected at the organizational meeting. All meetings of the Historical Committee shall be advertised to the public in accordance with the provisions of the Sunshine Act.

SECTION 8. Minutes of Historical Committee – The Historical Committee shall keep minutes of its meetings and activities and shall, on occasion, as requested, make oral and other written reports to the Borough Council, aside from the annual report noted previously. Minutes, at the minimum, shall include those persons in attendance at the meeting, Motions made by members of the Historical Committee, as well as any recommendations. The minutes shall be provided to the Borough Manager.

SECTION 9. Liaison to Historical Committee – Borough Council may appoint one (1) member of Borough Council as a liaison to the Historical Committee.

**SECTION 10. Authority** – Neither the Historical Committee nor any of its members shall have the authority to enter any contracts without the approval of Borough Council, to the extent same would impose any liability on the Borough.

SECTION 11. Severability — If any section, provision, or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect any other section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance so long as it remains legally enforceable minus the invalid portion. The Borough reserves the right to amend this Ordinance or any portion thereof from time to time as it shall deem advisable in the
